NEWSLETTER DEDICATION FROM MIKE

This newsletter is dedicated to the memory of former officer and a founding director of our present indoor range.

Olin LeRoy (1903-

1986) was a kind man, small in stature but with a big heart and a bigger sense of humor. This writer remembers as a youth how Mr. Olin LeRoy used to get a smile out of him. This former youth remembers Olin's newsletter, which I believe was called the LEADSPITTER, and how I looked forward to each edition. Olin was there when we built the indoor range on Winton Road South in Brighton. One day we had 21 of our 29 members helping install the roof trusses, plywood and shingles in two days. I also remember how at one work party Olin was in the attic working and when I turned around he was standing next to me.

Someone noticed and said:

"Olin, I thought you were in the attic." He responded, "I WAS!" (Then I saw the hole in the ceiling where he had fallen through and landed on his feet.)

Olin LeRoy was also responsible for "fathering" the Sporterifle program in the U.S.. That league has grown throughout New York State, part of Pennsylvania and has received national attention. The idea of shooting shoulder to shoulder with a light .22 rifle and a scope (no slings or other gear) at a simple target has caught on. His name is sometimes used in **Sporterifle Shootoff** awards. (We never did get the patent on that target designed by Olin !!)



Honors and Champions

At the August dinner, emcee Rich Funke asked for a show of hands of those who had ever won a New York State Shooting Championship (individual or team) or Empire State Games –Shooting medals and a bunch of hands went up. Pretty impressive...We have even had national champions and several national championship teams and members of national teams from the RRC. Olympian -- Jason Turner began shooting as a Junior at the RRC. Jason is currently on the World Shooting Team representing the U.S.A.. Last year the RRC had a male AND female national champion .22 rifle shooter.

This year we had a youth national champion – 14 year old Andre Gross who was getting an award from the American Legion the night of our RRC dinner. A special tribute about Andre and our long-time Junior Instructor –Jeff Lagendyk was read by Mike Drexler.

At the dinner, we also recognized several LONG-TIME members: Bill Donovan (former 70 years of membership, Don Drexler 67 years of membership, Barry Smith 60 years of membership.

IMPORTANT NOTICE regarding Spousal & Junior members on your renewal:

RRC must have a record of all members (including spousal and junior members) having had some form of basic firearms training before becoming a member and using the range. RRC's board made this retroactive to include all previous spousal members several years ago. If we have a record of such training, the spouse or junior member's name will be printed on the renewal notice. If the names are not printed on the form, it is no longer acceptable for you to write in the name, the RRC does <u>not</u> have a record of their compliance with the required training AND waivers. In this case, the spousal or junior's membership is not renewed and a paper membership card will not be issued despite the hand written name and payment of the renewal fee. Please contact me if my records are in error or to obtain the necessary training so the membership can be renewed.
